Domestic & International Marketing:

- US Wheat Associates. The USW board will hold the joint USW/NAWG Winter Board Meeting in Washington DC, January 10-14, 2022. All NWB members are encouraged to attend. The USW board will be voting on a by-law change and election of officers.
- Wheat Marketing Center. The WMC is seeking applications for a new director, as Janice Cooper announced her resignation. The WMC building is for sale and the ownership group is currently entertaining offers. The NWB will proceed with the Export Education Seminar at WMC the first full week of January. Currently there are six participants planning to attend.
- Wheat Foods Council. Sarah Ahrens is our representative on the board and she is out on maternity leave, no report available.
- Plains Grains Inc. Plains Grains met on November 17th in Denver. Updates to the new website dashboard were discussed, the large printed maps showing where wheat is grown in members states, types of wheat, rail shuttle loading locations, river ports, ocean ports, and milling facilities are illustrated. Updates to the collection and testing methodology were discussed along with succession planning.
- Wheat Quality Council. The WQC is planning to hold an in-person annual meeting in Kansas City, MO on February 22-24, 2022.

Research Update:

Dr. Katherine Frels reported on the University breeding program, variety release committee, and variety testing program.

US Wheat Report:

Mike Spier, Vice President, Overseas Operations gave a market update report via video conference to the board and answered questions regarding international trade.

Executive Director Update:

Office Update.

- Royce Schaneman reported on the upcoming office move from downtown to the fallbrook area of Lincoln. Operational changes will occur after the move with Nebraska Wheat Growers Association, to show a clear separation of the board and the producer organization. There will be a short tour of the new office space at the end of the meeting.
- The process regarding the open position is moving forward slowly.
- If a current board member is not able to attend the WMC Export Seminar, Royce Schaneman will attend to lead the group.
- The Attorney General's Office has some concerns with the Wheat Board contracting with the Dry Pea and Lentil Commission to provide day-to-day administrative services. More discussion is necessary to reach a conclusion.
- The proposed rule change for the NWB is still in process and follow-up in continuing.

- An update on public variety marketing and NU Horizon Genetics was given by Mark Knobel. The test variety had strong sales and the NU Horizon group is moving forward with seating a board of directors, developing a mission statement, and working with UNL to promote the varieties developed with producer investment. The goals are to reward the researchers, grow the wheat research program at UNL, and provide Nebraska producers the first opportunity to grow advanced varieties.
