Financial Review

Check-off Compliance

Domestic & International Marketing

- U.S. Wheat Associates, Bob: The summer meeting will be held June 29-July 1, 2021 in Nashville, TN. Royce, Sarah, Tyson and Bob will be attending.
- Food Aid, Kent: More money has been allotted to the program due to COVID relief payments. Last year, 5% of Hard Red Winter wheat sales were attributed to Food Aid.
- Wheat Marketing Center, Rick: The center should be fully opened by fall. Building discussions are ongoing.
- Wheat Foods Council, Sarah: The Annual Meeting will be held virtually in July.
- Plains Grains Inc., Larry: Larry attending the recent meeting in person in Denver, CO. Harvest updates have begun out of Texas and Oklahoma.
 - Mark Hodges showed the Board the new interactive maps, graphs and charts on the PGI website. The website will be live for everyone the week of June 21, 2021.
- Wheat Quality Council, Royce: The Spring Wheat Tour will be taking place in North Dakota in the upcoming month. They are expecting a smaller crowd.

University Report

- Hector Santiago: The University plans to return to on campus classes and have a normal semester in the fall. NWGA Report

 Sarah Ahrens: The Growers will have a booth for three days at the NE State Fair during the Largest Classroom Days to reach out to students. There will be no golf tournament held this year. The Growers submitted two proposals for education opportunities and federal legislation. The budget was set for FY 2021-2022.

Ambassador Report

- Jennifer Howsden and Emma Goosic prepared a video presentation of their ambassador experience that was shared with the Board.

Executive Director Report

- Agency move: The current layout gives the office space 980 square feet. The earliest the move would take place is in October, though the end of the year may be more realistic. The estimated cost to move is \$8,500.
- Seed sorter: The University of Minnesota offered \$2,500 for the sorter. Mark moved to sell the seed sorter to the University of Minnesota for \$2,500; Rick seconded. Voice vote, motion carried.
- Right of First Refusal: Tyson moved to approve that Royce will exercise the Right of First
 Refusal and sign the agreements for FY 21-22 on behalf of the Nebraska Wheat Board; Rick
 seconded. Voice vote, motion carried.

- Auditing: The audit has gone well. There will be an exit interview in the upcoming weeks that Bob will join via videoconferencing.
- Check-off increase: The process will begin at the beginning of FY 21-22.

First Reading of Funding Proposals

 There were four new proposals: Ag Sack Lunch Program, Website: ADA Compliant, Website: non-ADA compliant, and USDA Variety Survey. Mark moved to advance #54 Ag Sack Lunch Program and #72 USDA Variety Survey to the second reading; Larry seconded. Voice vote, motion carried.

Variety Development & Release Committee Update

Mark: All stakeholders met on Thursday, June 3, 2021 to discuss the proposed model. The Variety Release Committee will be updated and more inclusive, adding new ex officio members the committee recommended. NU Horizon Genetics is the potential name for the new marketing entity. The wheat variety NE15420 has been names Epoch. The Nebraska Wheat Board is giving up all of their royalties to help get the new model functioning. The biggest hurdle is who will own NU Horizon Genetics and how will it be structured. The Nebraska Wheat Board has exercised their Right of First Refusal on NE15420 and will request a license to market it. Mark moved that the NWB formally request to obtain a fully paid-up, non-exclusive license for Epoch (NE15420) and NB15420 in accordance with the research contracts; Kent seconded. Roll call vote: Rick, Y; Tyson, Y; Larry, Y; Kent, Y; Mark, Y; Bob, Y. 6 yes – 0 no. Motion carried.
