Nebraska Wheat Crop Report June 29, 2023

NEBRASKA WHEAT

USDA Crop Progress Report for the week ending June 25, 2023

Winter wheat condition rated 13% very poor, 17% poor, 30% fair, 36% good, and 4% excellent. Winter wheat headed 98%. Topsoil moisture condition rated 30% very short, 29% short, 39% adequate, and 2% surplus. Subsoil moisture condition rated 36% very short, 34% short, 29% adequate, and 1% surplus.

Northern Panhandle

In the northern panhandle consistent rain has increased the condition of the wheat and approximately 3/4 of the region's fields have turned color. A local producer stated that they are looking to have an uneven harvest due to the variance in fields. The condition of the crop has kept steady with 40% being good and the rest is fair with the occasional poor crop.

Southern Panhandle

The southern panhandle has seen an increase in moisture with scattered storms producing hail in some areas of the region. More moisture is expected by the end of this week. The wheat crop condition progresses and is also turning color. Harvest is still a couple weeks about and is expected to begin around the 15th.

The southwest region has seen a lack of rain recently and expecting some showers by the end of this week . The crop has seen an increase of weeds in fields that weren't sprayed. The drought has caused spotty wheat and is looking to produce an average of 20-30 bushels per acre. Harvest is still 10 to 15 days out which will be later than usual.

Southeast

Harvest is well underway in the southeast region of Nebraska, with still no sign of moisture. A producer shared that most of the area is yielding 30-40 bu/acre with test weight measuring at approximately 55-56 pounds. From the poor conditioned crop they are seeing anywhere from 10-25 bu/acre with small kernels and test weights that are below average.
